

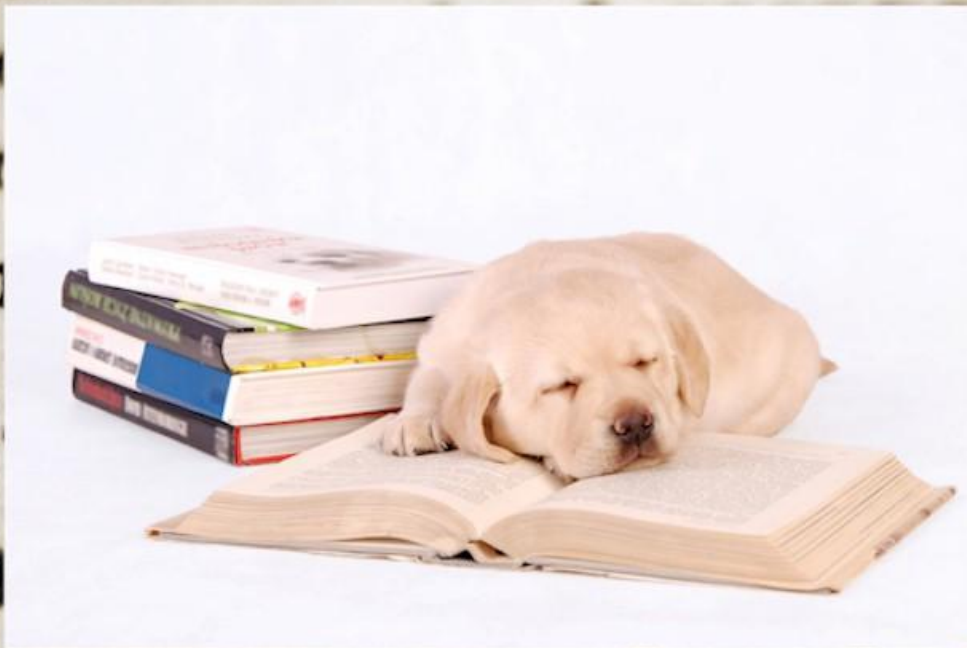

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Nouns and Pronouns

There are four different types of nouns.

Common nouns are words that name everyday objects. These are objects that you can see or touch.

Examples of common nouns are: cat, dog, pencil, school, car and house.

Proper nouns are names of particular places or people.

Examples of proper nouns are: John, Sarah, London, France, River Thames, Mount Everest and Blackheath School.

Collective nouns are words that name groups of people, animals, objects or places.

Examples of collective nouns are: class, herd, collection and queue.

Abstract nouns are words that name things that we cannot see or touch.

Examples of abstract nouns are: sadness, anger, idea, thought, kindness and intelligence.

Pronouns are used to avoid clumsy sentences which repeat the noun.

Common pronouns are:

I you he she it we you (plural) they

For example:

Find a chair and sit on **it**.

The children asked, "Are **we** there yet?"
